# Understanding European Oak Characteristics



## Colour Variations

Colour variations among different planks is a natural phenomenon, not a defect.



## Natural Grains

Various natural grains deliver the natural beauty of timbers.



## Live and Dead Knots (filled with putty)

Knots are an intrinsic part in the wood growing process where new fibres develop around dead branches.



## Worm Holes

Insect activities can leave marks on the surface of timber. These small holes can or may not be noticed, bring fun as a natural wood characteristic.



## Pith Rays

Pith Rays are called medullary rays or tiger stripes, store, and transport nutrients towards the outer zones radially.




## Checks and Shakes

Checks are the form of cracks normally developed when wood is seasoned. Shakes occur in the wood growing process, can be heart, star, cup, or ring shapes appearing on the surface of a finished piece of timber.

Quercus has limited and minor shakes and checks, maintaining the feature rather than exaggerating it.

All these characters are not often included in a single plank. In most cases, some or few features are allocated randomly in an area.

## Colour Aging

All European Oak experience colour aging, that is the oak flooring will age gracefully over time e.g. one or more years, typically turn darker. It is the uniqueness of natural timber.

## Can Be Sanded

Quercus can be re-sanded and recoated to breathe a new life because it has a thick solid timber veneer.

## Matte Finish

## Easy Maintenance

You do not have to polish the floor regularly like solid timber. Sweep or vacuum the dust or dirt. Scrub can be used for spot cleaning.

CE marked, in accordance with EN14342:2013, meets European standards of high safety, safety and environmental requirements.


## TnG profile

# Cleaning & Maintenance Guides



## Cleaning & Maintenance

Hardwood floors naturally show signs of wear over time. However, by following a few precautions and maintaining regular cleaning and maintenance routines, you can ensure years of beauty from your floor.



## Routine Cleaning

- Vacuum, sweep, or dust mop your floor weekly, using a vacuum with a brush or felt head attachment.
- Wipe up spills and tracked-in dirt immediately.
- Periodically clean the floor thoroughly with Hardwood Spray Cleaner using a swivel-head mop with a terry cloth cover.



## Avoidance Practices

- Avoid wet mopping with water, as it may permanently damage the floor.
- Avoid using ammonia-based cleaners, acrylic finishes, wax-based products, bleach, polishes, oil soap, abrasive cleaning soaps, or acidic materials such as vinegar on your floor.
- Avoid damaging the floor with shoes containing heel taps or sharp objects protruding from the sole.
- Avoid walking on wood floors with spike or stiletto heeled shoes, and use caution when moving heavy objects.
- Avoid using a steam mop on any of our floors.



## Preventive Measures

- Use interior and exterior doormats at entrances to collect dirt and moisture.
- Remove shoes with spiked or damaged heels before walking on the floor to prevent scratches and dents.
- Place area rugs in high traffic areas and in front of kitchen sinks.
- Keep pets' paws clean to prevent dirt or soil.
- Use furniture leg protector pads under all furniture and ensure they are clean and well-maintained.
- Protect the floor when moving heavy furniture or large appliances by placing them on mats and sliding them smoothly.
- Replace hard, narrow furniture rollers with wide rubber rollers.
- Protect the floor from direct sunlight using curtains and UV-resistant film on large glass doors and windows.
